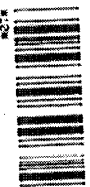

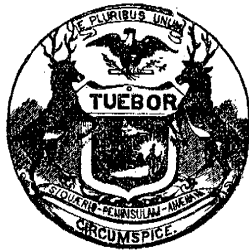

## REMINISCENCES.

---

### Early Days in Port Huron.

---

The Hon. Daniel B. Harrington came to this place in May, 1819, at which time your beautiful city of to-day, was a wilderness, a dense forest or wildwood, inhabited principally by Indians (Chippawas,) as a hunting ground; their tents, huts, wigwams, and a few block houses extended more up and down the rivers and lakes than back from them; at times, and they were somewhat troublesome.

There were a few Frenchmen scattered about, and became more numerous year after year.

Ansolum Petit, father to your fellow-townsmen, Edward Petit, lived in the first frame house ever built here, which, was located at or near the Hogan house, standing in Court street, as now laid out. One John Riley, a half breed Indian, occupied the second frame building built here, and which was about fourteen feet square, one story high, this one occupied the site, where now stands the finest hardware store in the State, Wm. Stewart at the head, these two buildings comprised all the houses here in 1819.

There was not a white inhabitant north of Fort Gratiot, on the east part of the lower peninsula, except some three or four families, scattered along up Black River and Mill Creek.

Opposite here, on the Canada shores, the present Sarnia was unknown, and only Indian camps marked the location.

A Mr. LaForge built the first house erected on that side.

The village of Port Huron was originally called Desmond township, embracing all that part of St. Clair County north of township five. At its first organization, the township meeting was held at Fort Gratiot, on the first Monday of May, 1826, at which time the follow-

ing officers were elected: Martin Pickens, Supervisor; Jeremiah Harrington, Isaac Dyvis, Assessors; Morris McGarvey, Isaac Davis, Richard Sansbury, Highway Commissioners; Reuben Dodge, Lewis Facer, Francis Duchein, Constables.

May 7th, 1835, the first village was *platted* property sold here, was disposed of by Mr. E. Petit, in that part of fractional section 11, south of Black River, comprising about nineteen acres, it being called in the plat, the village of Peru.

The next piece platted and sold, was the east part of the south-east quarter of section ten, which was platted by D. B. Harrington, and sold by Messrs. White & Harrington, in the Fall of 1835.

In about 1837, the next or third piece of property platted, was sold by Major John Thorn, that part of section eleven, north of Black River, and a small fraction of about three acres on section two, and was called Paris.

Soon after this, the Huron Company platted the north-east fraction of section ten.

Mr. D. B. Harrington has the satisfaction and honor of giving this place the name of PORT HURON, followed by Mr. Petit, Thorn, and others in their interests.

The first school house erected here, was by Francis P. Browning, original owner of the Black River Steam Mill, and the few citizens living here at the time, it was located on the west side of the "Park" north side of Black River

Mr. John Miller came here in April, 1827, locating himself about six miles out, and more in the timber lands. In the fall of 1832, he came to this point, and engaged as clerk for the Mill Company in their store when only thirteen years of age, since when, has made Port Huron his home, and is now doing a banking business here.

The business of the Steam Mill Company was carried on, on the site now occupied by Messrs. Skinner and Ames. This Company and a Mr. Jonathan Burtch, also a Merchant, were the only ones doing a mercantile business here at this date. The latter's store stood on south side of River street, just west of Huron avenue. Their trade was principally with the Indians, a few French, and an occasional new comer.

In those days there were no wagon roads, much less, a wagon in the township, they only knew the beaten trails of the natives and wild beasts, for game was more plenty in those days than of to-day, by these trails the inhabitants were directed to their rendezvous.

There were two or three mills only, located up Black River and Mill Creek; no bridges as now, but it was paddle your own canoe, or swim the streams.

In 1826, Mr. Michael L. Kerley built a store and Warehouse on the present site of Messrs Hull & Boyce Hardware store, Water st., afterwards it was occupied as a hotel by Messrs. Sampson & Beebee.

The first hotel built here, was of logs, and kept open for public entertainment to travelers, by Lewis Facer in 1827; it was located on the site now occupied by A. W. Comstock Quay street.

The second was a frame hotel, and stood near where P. J. O'Neil's store is, but in the street as now laid out, this was kept by two lawyers, Ira Porter and Hosea Powers. Although the building has been removed, it still exists, and is the residence of Barney D. Austin to-day.

The third, and fourth, was the erection of the American House, now the Central House, built and kept by Elijah Burtch, and a hotel erected on or near the site of L. S. King's stables, and was built by Messrs Halsted & Whitcome, the latter having been opened before the American—about 1835.

Notwithstanding the above, Mr. James H. Cook carried on a store here first of any of the others, being located at the mouth of Black River, where Messrs. Muir, Livingstone & Co's. ship yard now is.

Up to 1827 there were not more than perhaps five or six buildings in this place.

In 1833, the road now known as the Military road was built, and a bridge put across Black River.

In 1832, during the Blackhawk war, the citizens of Port Huron turned out *en masse*, and helped palisade the Fort. The present Fort was unknown until 1812, when the United States Government established a Fort, and garrisoned it with American soldiers. The commanding officer at the Fort in 1829, was Major Alexander R. Thompson. In 1822 it was evacuated, and this palisade occurred over its occupancy. Prior to 1812, it may have been known as a prominent point, from the French settlement, and camps around it.

The first steamboat built here was by Mr. John P. Phillips.

Messrs Mason and Horton are said to have built the second saw-mill put up here, and which is now owned by W. B. and J. Hibbard.

On the 8th of April, 1857, the village of Port Huron became a city under a Charter according to law, at which time the City Council met for the first time; W. L. Bancroft presiding, as the first Mayor.

To-day you have a city of no less than 6,000 inhabitants, its limits extending from north to south upwards of three miles in length by nearly one and a half miles in width.

The St. Clair river from the foot of Butler street across to Sarnia lacks only a very few chains of one mile.

The early settlement of Port Huron is of minor importance when compared to her standing and interests of to-day for the pres-

ent is always the greater consideratum. suffice it, then, a brief history has been given here, but a more extensive one is recorded in the City and County Clerk's offices, which, with those survivors of earlier days, go far in eulogy over her past, present and future prosperity.

The natural advantages surrounding this point are superior to all others without doubt. It is only a question of time before this must rank among the first cities of the State in points of interests and population.

While fed from her lakes, rivers and railroads, monopolies and increasing wealth gives impulse to all the pursuits of other Ports.

Could we give a true rendering of the enormous traffic done by the Grand Trunk Railway, the Port Huron and Lake Michigan Railroad and the Great Western Railway of Canada opposite at Sarnia, such a reflex of the lake and river traffic, one would scarce believe, and the possession of these facts would be an item of proud record here, if it were possible to obtain them at this time, as it is we can only refer you to a list of vessels whose home port is Port Huron, elsewhere, and let this suffice.

One mile and a half north lies Fort Gratiot, opposite of which lies Point Edwards, Canada, at which places the Grand Trunk Railway cross their trains by means of a Ferry. In connection with these great feeders to Port Huron is Black River leading upwards of one hundred miles distant, into the great Pineries of Michigan, while along her banks are a great number of Mills, manufacturing lumber, and who ship to all parts of the country. Statistics would be at this point a most desirable reflex; this river is constantly filled with logs, and thousands upon thousands seen floating at this point lie waiting to be cut by the numbers of mills here of which not all are given elsewhere in the Business Directory.

Perhaps in no place in this State, of the size of Port Huron, are so many mills and manufactories as here, from these several arteries flow in and out all the products of Great Michigan, with all the luxury and wealth of any State in the Union.

The enterprise of Port Huron supports a Street Railway, one-and-three quarter miles in length, a gas light company, and have regular laid out streets, with their names soon to be put up on every street corner, and houses numbered, which gives the whole a cityfied appearance; add to this a requisit number, eight Churches, four Ward Schools, aside from several others, select and otherwise, which accommodate upwards of one thousand school children, the city's boast; add to this from thirteen to fifteen Hotels or Public Houses it takes to accommodate the demads of the public, and here it would be well to add that another one, a large First Class Hotel—European style of course—is much needed; then there are two Printing estab-

ishments, (one run by steam) each of which issue weekly papers, and do the job work most satisfactorily for all demands made upon them, then there are two fine wagon and foot bridges which cost the city one \$18,000 and the other \$6,000; a Dry Dock in course of construction for Messrs Muir, Livingstone & Co., which when completed will probably cost from \$30,000 to \$50,000. At this juncture it is well to notice that many boats have been, and are being built and repaired here. (*See boats elsewhere, and advertisements*.) Messrs Fitzgerald & Leighton, and these two firms we believe take the lead in this line of business here.

Two large Ferry boats ply between this and the Canada side one at this point to Sarnia, and one between Fort Gratiot and Point Edwards, then there are six lines of Stages leaving this point for various places. A U. S. Fort garrisoned at Fort Gratiot, about one mile distant north, and with this brief allusion, and a glimpse at our Business Directory, showing the mercantile interests, trades and professions carried on in this busy hive of industry, and a reflex of the enterprise of her citizens as shown by their liberal advertising among these pages, goes far to prove their liberality, ability and their anxiety for the welfare and prosperity of their city. Of such we could not hesitate but rather recommend them to those buying, believing them more justly deserving our liberal support and general esteem.

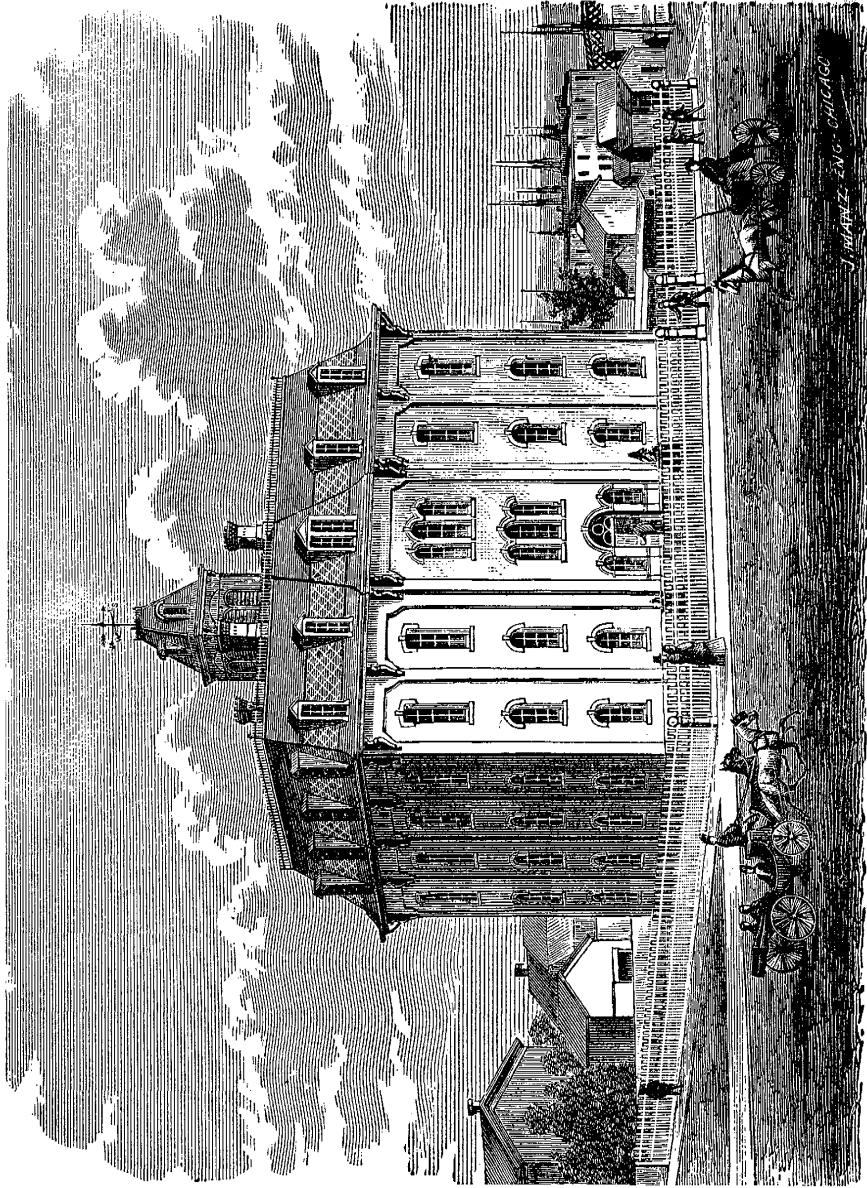

### CHURCHES.

FIRST REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCH—West side Superior, between Butler and Broad streets. Rev. J. Donnelly, jr., Pastor — Church organized Sept. 20th, 1863, with fourteen members. House of Worship dedicated Dec 8th, 1863. Enlarged in the summer of 1870, at a cost of \$3,200. Present Membership, 187. Capacity for comfortably seating 500 persons. Total cost of Church building \$11,000, of Parsonage adjacent \$4,000. Sabbath services at 10 30 a.m. and 7 p.m. Prayer meetings on Monday and Wednesday evenings.

FIRST CONGREGATIONALIST CHURCH — Located on the South west corner of Seventh and Wall Streets. Rev. James S. Hoyt, Pastor. This Church edifice was erected in 1860, of brick, and cost about \$20,000. In 1868 it was repaired, and furnished with an organ, at an additional expense of about \$7,000, and will now comfortably seat 750 persons. The Parsonage, belonging to and adjacent the Church, cost \$7,000. The first organization of this Church was made in 1840, consisting of only twenty members; since when they have occupied three sites or Church buildings, including the present one. Membership up to the present time, 476, and Rev. Mr. Hoyt is their fifth Pastor. Sabbath services 10:30 a.m. and 7 p.m. Young people's meetings 8 p.m. Mondays. Prayer meetings 6 p.m. Sundays and 7 p.m. Wednesdays. A good Sabbath school is in connection.





**GRACE CHURCH**—Is located on the West side of Sixth street between Wall and Court streets. Rev. Wm. Stowe, Rector. The Church was organized in 1841, with forty-eight members. Present membership numbers ninety-three. The present wooden structure has become inadequate to accommodate present demands and measures have been taken to rebuild of brick; and we hope ere another two years roll by we can record these measures filled.

**UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH**.—Unfinished and unoccupied. Located on the north side of Broad corner Michigan streets. Services are held in rooms over Dr. J. G. Parker's drug store, west side Huron avenue. bet. River and Butler; Rev. Thos. Bracken Pastor, whose residence is corner Fort and Park, having moved since going to press.

**GERMAN LUTHERAN CHURCH**, s. w. corner Pine and Seventh; Rev. C. Bofinger, Pastor.

**METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH**—Located on the corner of Sixth and Water streets. This building was erected in 1851, and cost about \$10,000; will seat about 400 persons; present membership, 160; Rev. A. F. Bourns Pastor, No. 465 Court street; services Sabbath days, 10 1-2 A. M., and 7 P. M.; Sabbath school at 12 M; Prayer meeting Sabbath evenings, at 6 o'clock, and on Thursday evenings at 7 o'clock.

The parsonage, on the corner of Eighth and Court streets, cost the Society about \$3,000.

**FIRST SPIRITUAL SOCIETY**—Organized April 24th, 1868, with 38 members. Their Hall is located on the corner of Pine and Military streets. Officers—John L. Newell Pres.; James H. White, Sec'y; James H. Haslett, Treas; Dan'l. B. Harrington, Chas. S. Penney, Thos. Dunford, Sam'l. W. Hamilton, John Buzzard. The above are all Trustees of the Society.

**St. Stephens Roman Catholic Church**, located n. w. cor. Eric and Broad; Rev. Edward Van Lauwe pastor. Organized in Aug. 1850; present membership, about 1,800. Building cost already \$25,000, and as yet unfinished, will seat about 700. Regular services, 8 1-2 A. M., 10 1-2 A. M., and 3 P. M. Sundays, and 7 A. M. every day during the week. Sunday school, 2 1-2 P. M., number scholars, 250.

### SCHOOLS.

The Board of Education, consists of Samuel L. Boyce, Pres., Wm. Hartsuff, Antoine Marontate; 1st. Ward, Henry Fish, H. L. Stevens; 2d Ward, Cyrus Miles, Thos. S. Skinner, 3d Ward, B. C. Farrand, Peter Hill; 4th. Ward, Lewis Atkins Clerk, J. B. Hull, Treasurer.

Regular meetings occur first Tuesdays of each month, in the City Council Rooms.

The High School building occupies perhaps the most central and sitely location to be had in the city, it being on the west side of Erie, between Butler and Broad streets.

The building is substantially built of brick, five stories high, including a stone basement, and a Mansard roof, with a tin deck and dormer windows; dimensions, 68x86 feet, the upper story is sixteen feet high, and contains four spacious rooms. Upon each floor are four rooms, 31x31 feet. In the stone basement the Janitor lives, and the fuel rooms and furnace for heating the entire building. Nine hundred scholars can be furnished sittings in this building.

Mr. S. T. Probett took the contract Sept 25th, 1869, for putting up this building, and completed it Sept 1st, 1870. The expense to the city is as follows:

The whole is a fine specimen of architecture, and does great credit to the builder as well as to the city.

About eighty per cent of the children of school age in the city now, have accommodations.

The school property held by the board amounts to about \$75,000.

In connection with this school, is a good library, a fine reading room, a geological philosophical and chemical laboratory.

The south Branch is located on Court Square between Sixth and Seventh, Wall and Court streets.

This building is of brick, large size, but poorly calculated, and is getting somewhat old, and out of style.

It cost \$17,000; lots and furniture, \$4,000. It contains eight rooms, and will accommodate about 400 scholars.

TEACHERS—Grammar school, Miss Rachael Boyce, Preceptress; Miss Emma Tremaine, Ass't; Intermediate department, Mrs. A. B. Comstock, teacher; Secondary department, Miss Della Tremaine, teacher; Primary department, A., Miss Clara Follonsbee; B., Miss Amelia H. Dole; C., Miss Kate Young.

The Lapeer avenue school building, is another fine new brick structure, located on the west side of Twelfth, between Gillett and Lapeer avenue. It was erected in 1869, by H. N. Wright, at a cost of \$8,150. Three lots \$600, furniture \$800, and contains four rooms, which will seat about 225 scholars. Teachers—Intermediate department, Miss Mary Dwyer; Secondary, Miss Joanna Hogan; Primary, Miss Jennie Walker.

Fourth Ward School house, is located on the South side of Division, between Seventh and Eighth streets. It is an old wooden structure, but we learn the Board intends erecting another in its stead, after the style of Lapeer avenue school building, at an early day; Primary school, Miss Jennie Long, teacher.

In addition to the above protestant schools, there is one Roman Catholic school, located on the west side of Superior, between Park and Broad streets; Miss Coyle teacher.

There is also a German school, of which we know too little to say more than Rev. C. Bofinger and C. Lehr, one or both, have some knowledge probably.

The aggregate attendance in all the schools in the city, is upwards of one thousand.

A High School Reading Room Association, have recently organized and occupy one room in the High School building. From present prospects, this association seems destined to become of much interest and importance; already they have upwards of eighty daily and weekly newspapers, a large number of magazines, and free access to the school library of three hundred volumes.

Officers are as follows: Prof. H. C. Baggerly, Pres.; Chas. Herzog Sec'y; Miss Susie Dwyer, Treas.

The young ladies of the High school intend and will organize a similar association, perhaps before this work is out.

High School Debating Club, consisting of gentlemen only, occupies a room in the High school building—meet every Friday evening.

Comstock, Mrs. B. C. Farrand, Mrs. Henry Fish, Mrs. Eliza W. Glover, Mrs. J. B. Hull, Mrs. James Haynes, Mrs. P. Morse, Mrs. Wm. Sanborn, Mrs. J. W. Thompson, Mrs. A. H. Wright and Miss Emma M. Farrand; a constitution was formed and adopted, and the Association proceeded to the election of officers, which was as follows: Mrs. B. C. Farrand, Pres; Mrs. E. W. Glover, Vice Pres; Mrs. A. H. Wright, Sec'y; Mrs. J. B. Hull, Treas; Mrs. A. B. Comstock, Librarian. Annual election of officers occurs the last Saturday of each year. Present officers for 1870 are Mrs. H. L. Stevens, Pres; Mrs. Eliza W. Glover, Vice Pres; Mrs. F. W. Huntington, Rec. Sec'y; Mrs. A. H. Wright, Financial Sec'y; Mrs. Carrie F. Balentine, Corresponding Sec'y; Mrs. J. B. Their library consists of 710 volumes and constantly increasing—their present location was made March 4th, 1869, the day President U. S. Grant was inaugurated.

In connection with this Association are given frequent lectures, literary, dramatic and social amateur entertainments. Thursday and Friday evenings, Oct. 13th, 1870, one of these dramatic entertainments were given in the parlors of Mrs. E. W. Glover, which was highly applauded and universally approved. From a programme of this entertainment in our possession it is regretted in not having space to give it in full.

Legacy—Their first bequest was made by Mrs. Alva Sweetser at her death of \$1,000 as a building fund. The ladies of this Association are now contemplating buying grounds and locating a fine building.

According to the recent census, in St. Clair County, there are 2,711 farms, 228 manufacturing establishments, and 6,868 dwellings.

The official returns for the city of Port Huron for 1870, show a population of 5,973 against 5,294, *exclusive* of *soldiers* in 1868.

The quantity known as a barrel of fruit, root or vegetables shall be two and one-half bushels, equivalent to sixty-eight hundred and seventy cubic inches ; approved March 8th, 1869.

The half bushel, or parts thereof, shall be the standard measure for fruits and other commodities customarily sold by heaped measure, and in measuring such commodities, the half bushel or other smaller measures, shall be heaped as high as may be, without especial effort or design.

**AN OLD SETTLER**—Rev. Dr. Norman Nash was born in Ellington, Conn., Nov. 17th, 1790, and died Nov. 11th, 1870, making him about 80 years of age at his death. On the 24th of October the writer paid him a visit while taking names for a City Directory, at which time we learned that he had been a Physician and Episcopal Clergyman, but old age had put him beyond an active life. He gave his signature to an order for a copy of this Directory, which was probably about the last act of this kind he ever done, and informed us that in 1825 he passed through here, then a Missionary to Green Bay, Wis., stopping over a few days, in what is now known as Fort Gratiot, where he preached and baptised several children; this he told us was before a Fort was established there or the place even had a name, and but few houses there. In 1836 he returned to Port Huron, purchased land and settled upon it, since which time he has been identified among the first and best of our fellow citizens. Occasionally he officiated in marriage ceremonies, and few are yet among you who remember him in this capacity, and in the ceremonies of baptism. On Sunday, Nov. 13th, his remains were borne at the head of a procession of thirty-five carriages to their final resting place whose borne no traveler returns,

They have no superiors for facilities for cutting all kinds of lumber for building purposes, and they make a speciality for cutting and furnishing bridge timbers. They keep on hand seasoned lumber, dressed and matched or otherwise to supply orders on shortest notice. Their lumber is shipped by rail over the Port Huron and Lake Michigan Railroad to the St. Clair River, thence finds a market in nearly every State in the Union. Their yards for wholesaling or retailing are located on the corner of Fourth and Griswold streets. Office over the Post Office.

**SHINGLES.**—Messrs Young & Fessenden, manufacturers of sawed Shingles and other work, have recently established themselves here, August, 1870, and have already grown into a large trade in their line of manufacture. They employ quite a number of workmen, and turn out twenty thousand shingles per day, aside from their other manufactures. Their Shingles give perfect satisfaction, and they find it difficult to fill orders as fast as they come in. At present parties in Ohio take all they can make, and pay the highest market price.—These gentlemen bid fair to become both popular and extensive manufacturers, from close application to business and present indications.

**BREWERIES.**—Messrs Hendricks & Russell, Brewers of Amber Ales and Porter, have built up a new nice trade in their line, and manufacture Ales and Porter which cannot be excelled in quality in the Western States. Their product finds extensive market and ready sale for all they can produce. The corps of hands employed at this Brewery turn out 2,000 barrels of Ale and about 2,000 dozen bottles annually.

Messrs John B. and John Billenstein, Lager Beer Brewers, are doing a snug business. After long experience they have become extensively known as brewers who understand their business. Their Beer has an extensive demand as may be seen. In 1869 upwards of 900 barrels of Lager was manufactured and sold, leaving them short for 1870.

It is said that Robert Walsh owns 105 buildings in the city of Port Huron.
