PORT HURON.

It is not our purpose to give here a history of the city of Port Huron. To collect the facts necessary to make such a history of any value, would require months of labor, and an expense not warranted by the character of this work, or the income to be derived from its publication. The few important facts in its history which we shall note will, however, be of some value for reference.

In the year 1686 a French military post was established at the point where Fort Gratiot is now located, which is within the city limits of Port Huron. This fort was called St. Joseph, and was occupied for about two years. After its abandonment no further settlement was attempted at this point until 1790, 104 years later. During that time, and, indeed, for some time afterward, the ground on which the city of Port Huron is built was a favorite camping place for the Indians, as many as 3,000 being in camp here at one time. In the summer of 1790 seven Frenchmen with their families located here, their names being as follows: Anselm Petit, Francois Lerviere, Battiste Levais, Duchem, Jarvais, Coarneais, and Moreaux. M. Jarvais built a saw mill on what is now called Indian Creek, then known as la Riviere Jarvais. Black River was then known as la Riviere Delude.

During the war of 1812 the settlers were obliged to leave their homes, but they returned in 1815 with reinforcements, and again took possession of their homes.

Edward Petit, it is supposed, was the first white child born within the territory now included in the city of Port Huron. He was a son of Anselm Petit, and was born in a log house near the foot of Court Street, February 7, 1813. Mr. Edward Petit is now living, and is a large property holder in the city of Port Huron and vicinity. Anselm Petit built the first frame house here, in the year 1819. The same year Mr. Daniel B. Harrington located here, and John Riley, a half-breed, built a house near the point where Military Street crosses Black River, on the site now occupied by

the hardware store of Wm. Stewart & Co. At that time nearly the whole of the Territory of Michigan was a wilderness.

Originally the village and township were called Desmond. The township was organized in 1826, a meeting being held on Monday, May 6, at Fort Gratiot, when the following officers were chosen:

Supervisor—Martin Pickens.

Assessors—Jeremiah Harrington, Isaac Davis.

Highway Commissioners—Morris McGarvey, Isaac Davis, Richard Stansbury.

Constables—Reuben Dodge, Lewis Facer, Francis Duchem.

In 1835 portions of the territory south of Black River were platted and offered for sale by Edward Petit and Messrs. White & Harrington, the village so laid out being called Peru. In 1837 Major John Thorn platted a small piece of land on the north side and called it Paris. The name Port Huron was first applied by Mr. D. B. Harrington to his plat, the owners of other plats following, and thus consolidating the whole under one name.

The present site of Fort Gratiot, on the northern limits of the city, was occupied as a military post in 1814, by a detachment of regulars and militia under Major Forsythe, of the regular army. Capt. Gratiot was the engineer officer who built the first fort, and after whom it was named. The cost of the work was about three hundred dollars. In 1822 the post was abandoned, and the buildings in it were turned over to two Presbyterian missionaries named Hart and Hudson. In 1828 the post was reoccupied by the military, when the buildings and grounds were improved and strengthened. Since that time the fort has always been occupied by a small garrison, except during the Mexican war and the Rebellion.

Port Huron continued a village for over 20 years, until 1857, when a city charter was granted, and William L. Bancroft was elected the first Mayor. Lists of city officers since that time, with the votes at the several elections, are given with other statistical information in the latter pages of this book. Statistics of the village government are very meagre, and the recollection of old citizens as to the time a village charter was granted, or anything else of importance was done, is generally very indistinct. It seems, however, that the village became a corporation in 1842 or 1843. The first newspaper published here was called the *Lake Huron Observer*, and was started in 1836 or 1837 by Daniel B. Harrington.

The most important branches of business carried on here at the present time, and for many years past, are the cutting of lumber, and ship building. They give employment to several hundred men, and support nearly as many families. The Port Huron & Lake Michigan, and Grand Trunk Railroad Companies also give employment to a large number of men who reside in the city. The Grand Trunk Road was opened for business in the fall of 1858. The Port Huron & Lake Michigan Road was opened to Flint in December, 1871.

The marine interests of the city are also very large, many officers and sailors residing here with their families, and many vessels, especially tugs, being owned here. A full list of these is given elsewhere. During the past 10 years a large wholesale trade has been built up with dealers in the country lying to the north, north-west and west, especially in the hardware and grocery trades, and this is growing rapidly. The sections of country seeking a market in Port Huron are the whole of St. Clair County, a large portion of Sanilac County, and considerable portions of Lapeer and Macomb Counties.

At the present time the population of Port Huron city exceeds 7,000, as more fully set forth in tables elsewhere, and is rapidly increasing. The population of the village of Fort Gratiot, which is the northern suburb of the city, is nearly 900. The present limits of the city of Port Huron, as set forth in the act of incorporation, are as follows:

“Beginning at a point on the national boundary line on the St. Clair river directly opposite and in a line with the south line of fractional section fifteen in the township of Port Huron, and running thence westerly along said south line of said fractional section fifteen to the east line of section sixteen; thence north along said line and said line extended, to the middle of Black river; thence up said Black river to the north-west corner of the military reservation; thence easterly on the north line of said military reservation to the national boundary line in St. Clair river; thence southerly along said boundary line to the place of beginning.”

The city is at present divided into four wards; the First lying north of Black River, bounded east by St. Clair River and west by Huron Avenue; the Third embracing the remainder of the territory north of Black River; the Second lying south of Black River and east of Seventh Street; and the Fourth embracing the remainder of the territory south of Black River.

Under the city charter the city government consists of a Mayor, Clerk, Treasurer, and Street Commissioner, elected annually, the first Monday in April, on a general ticket; a Recorder, elected once in three years, and holding office for that time; four Justices of the Peace, holding office four years, and elected one each year on the general ticket; and eight aldermen, holding office for two years, one being elected from each ward each year. The Common Council also elects yearly a City Marshal and an assistant, and a City Attorney, with such other officers and assistants as may be required, and two members of the Board of Education. This Board consists of eight members, two from each ward, holding office for four years. Also every three years a City Assessor, who is *ex officio*, a member of the Board of Supervisors. One Supervisor is elected each year from each ward. The Mayor also appoints yearly one member of the Board of Public Works, subject to approval or rejection by the Council. This body consists of four members, one from each ward, holding office each for four years, and having general charge and management of public works in the city.

The principal public works and buildings in the city are two school buildings on the south side of Black River, the large one on the north side having been burned in the spring of 1873; the new City Hall and County Court House, on the north side of Black River, in the Third Ward; the Engine House on Water Street; Pine Grove Park, in the Third Ward; the City Cemetery; and the new Waterworks building, also in the Third Ward. It is expected that the machinery of the Waterworks will be put in, and the piping laid, during the summer of 1873. All the above are owned by the city. The city also owns a Clapp & Jones Steam Fire Engine, with horses, harness and other equipments, hose and carts, hooks and ladders, and a hand fire engine. No pavements have as yet been laid in the city, and no sewers have been built up to this time (spring of 1873). The city gas works, and the Port Huron & Fort Gratiot Street Railway, are owned by private companies.

Full statistical information regarding public works, church and other societies, city and county officers, elections, etc., will be found in the latter pages of this book, as shown by the index.

STREETS.

THEIR NAMES AND ORDER.

North Side Black River—Streets Running North and South.

COMMERCIAL street runs parallel with St. Clair river from Black River n to Broad.

MERCHANT street runs parallel with and next w of Commercial from Quay n to Lincoln Ave.

HURON street runs parallel with and next w of Merchant from Black River n to Suffern.

FORT street runs parallel with and next w of Huron from Black to Merchant.



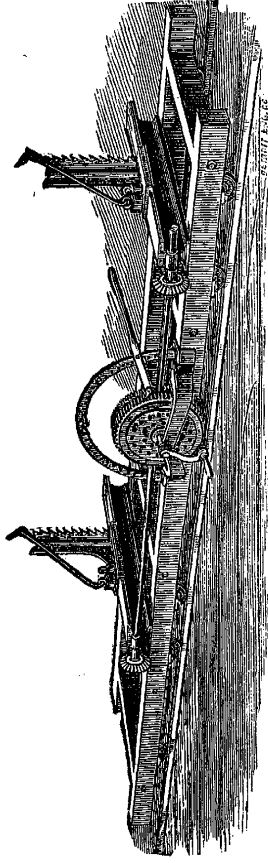

The enrollment of pupils for the year is about 1,500, and the average daily attendance 750.

The city has a school building in the Second Ward, three stories in height, capable of accommodating about 400 pupils, which cost \$20,000; and one in the Fourth Ward, capable of accommodating about 250 pupils, which cost, with grounds and improvements, \$10,000. At the time of this writing the contract for rebuilding the High School building in the Third Ward has been let to S. T. Probett & Son, at a price that will make its cost when completed, without furniture or heating apparatus, about \$30,000, and its entire value, with grounds and improvements, about \$37,000.

The amount of taxes for school purposes in 1872 was \$18,000. The amount paid to teachers and janitors was \$10,450. The school census of 1872 showed 2,415 children between the ages of five and twenty years in the city. The school tax for 1873 is \$23,000.

CHURCHES AND CHURCH SOCIETIES.

POPULATION.

By the State census of 1864 Port Huron had a population of 4,025. By the United States census of 1870 it was 5,973. A census taken by the canvasser of this Directory shows a total population at the present time of 7,100. The First Ward has 1,700, the Second Ward 1,200, the Third Ward 1,700, and the Fourth Ward 2,500. The registration for the spring election of 1873 was about 1,200. The number of unnaturalized foreigners in the city is very large.

The District of Huron was organized October 1st, 1866. It extends from New Baltimore, Mich., to Duncan City. John P. Sanborn, Collector; James H. White, Deputy Collector. Headquarters at Port Huron. The new custom house building, for which Congress has appropriated \$200,000, will be located on the corner of Water and Sixth streets, in the Second Ward.
